

Ernie Emu lived out in the bush. He lived with his Mum, Dad, and his older brother Eddie Emu.






An adult should always be in the water with kids!



Mum and Dad Emu knew they needed to swim with Ernie. It doesn't take very long for something bad to happen in the water.




The Emus all cooled down in the water together. SPLISH! SPLASH! Ernie was having so much fun!

Ernie" she said to Dad Emu.


"He's not a strong swimmer."

The current was getting stronger, and he was being swept away into some rocks.




Hey grown-ups!
